



A Guide to Blogging in Flickr – 1


Having created a Flickr account and uploaded your image, select the image you wish to blog, by clicking on its image in the photostream. Then click on “Blog This” icon in the menu bar above the picture.



If you have not already entered the details of your blog, Flickr will prompt you to do so.




Make sure you select the correct kind of blog (Anarchaeology uses Wordpress).






Insert the blog address and your log in details.



Confirm them.




You've added a blog to your account.






Choose a template layout for blogging from Flickr. We suggest the 2nd template (240 pixels etc).



Preview the layout and confirm by pressing the "use this" button.




Now return to your photostream and select the image you wish to blog. On the image's page, click on the "blog This" button and select the 'Anarchaeology' blog to post it to.

Use this page to write the content of your post and give the blog post a specific name (the default will be the name of your image). Click 'post entry' to publish it to the blog.
