Why is the ground so dry?

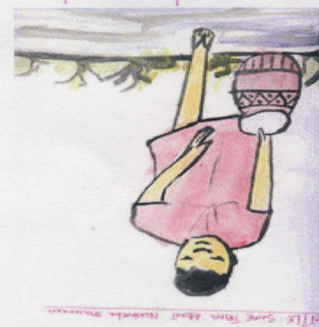
The ground is dry because of

What time does your school start and finish?

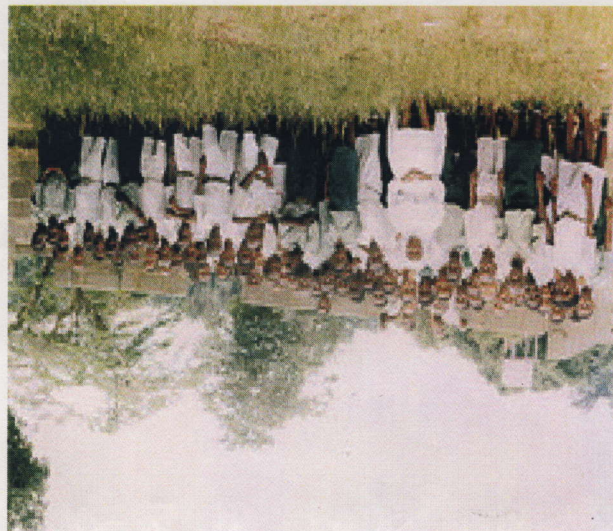
My school starts at 7.30am and finishes at 4.00pm

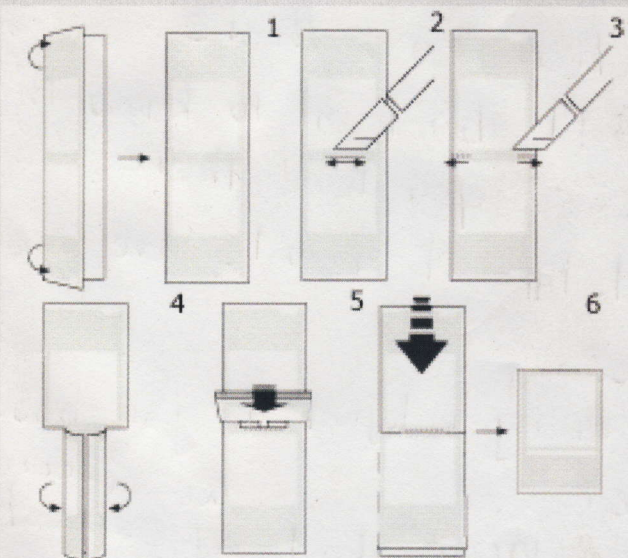
