We hope you enjoy doing this. We really look forward to reading your book and thank you for your effort in making this.

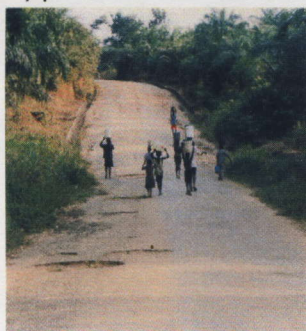

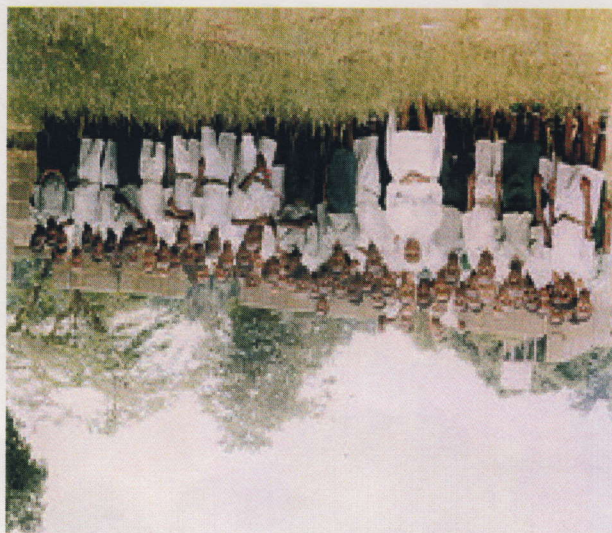

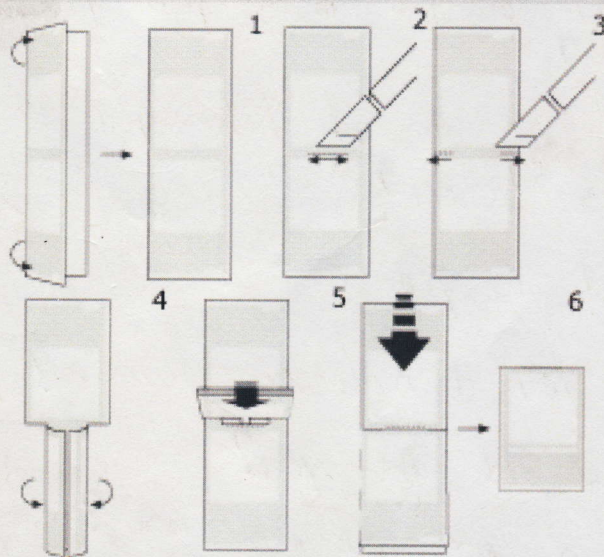

NO, I have never used a computer.

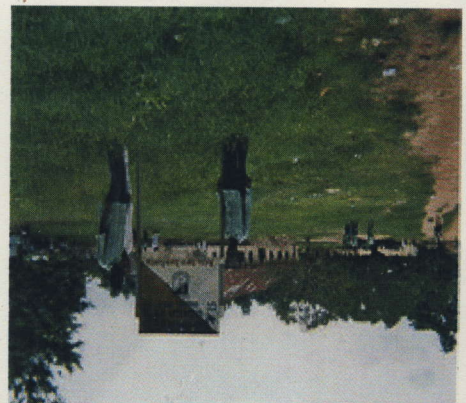
Have you been on the internet and where did you go to use it?
